### THE BANGLADESH ACCORD UNPRECEDENTED COMMITMENTS

- Independent inspections by professional safety engineers
- Full public reporting
- Brands/retailers must require factories to undergo all necessary renovations and must help pay for them
- Brands/retailers must leave any factory that refuses to become safe
- Central role for workers and unions: union access, OHS committees, right to refuse dangerous work
- All commitments binding and enforceable

### THE BANGLADESH ACCORD SIGNATORIES AND SCOPE




- 217 companies: H&M, Inditex (Zara), PVH, adidas, Abercrombie, Benetton, Tesco, Marks & Spencer, El Corte Ingles, Esprit, UNIQLO, American Eagle, Carrefour
- 22 university licensees
- International unions (UNI and Industriall), Bangladeshi garment unions, and labor rights NGOs as witnesses
- More than 1,600 factories and 2.5 million workers more than half of all production in Bangladesh
- 200 staff in Dhaka, including 100 safety engineers, plus case handlers, worker outreach staff, trainers

#### **PROGRESS**




56% of all identified safety issues reported or verified as corrected





#### PROGRESS - CONT.

- 1,388 factories behind schedule
- 57 factories on track
- 7 factories completed all remediation from initial inspections





### **CONSEQUENCES FOR REFUSAL TO RENOVATE**

 19 factories whose business with Accord signatory companies has been terminated for failure to implement mandatory safety improvements



#### COLLEGIATE PRODUCTION IN BANGLADESH

- 19 licensees report sourcing university goods from Bangladesh
- 27 disclosed factories
- Average rate of progress at:
  - All Accord factories = 58%
  - Collegiate factories = 65%
- 18 licensees have signed Accord
- 1,288 hazards identified at collegiate factories
- 800 hazards remediated







### FIRE SAFETY INSPECTIONS AT COLLEGIATE FACTORIES: EXAMPLE OF FINDINGS

- Lack of proper fire doors
- Open stairwells, which will act as chimneys in a fire, funneling smoke to higher floors and blocking workers' escape
- Exit stairs that lead to interior ground floor, not outside
- Boiler rooms with unprotected openings
- Lack of adequate emergency lighting



### STRUCTURAL SAFETY INSPECTIONS AT CONSORTIUM COLLEGIATE FACTORIES: EXAMPLES OF FINDINGS

- Visible cracks in building columns, walls and floor slabs
- Excessive loads beyond the structure's capacity
- Addition of new structures without proper design or impact study
- Water damage in building roof and walls
- Failure to develop load management plan
- No certificate of occupancy

## ELECTRICAL SAFETY INSPECTIONS AT WORKER RIGHTS CONSORTIUM COLLEGIATE FACTORIES: EXAMPLES OF FINDINGS

- Unprotected electrical cables
- Storage of flammable material in electrical room and near electrical panel
- Electrical circuits lack circuit breaker
- Lighting in storage areas not properly covered/protected

- Seven licensees sourcing from Bangladesh have not signed Accord:
  - Ash City Worldwide
  - CC Creations
  - College Laundry
  - VF

- Milestone Clothing Resources
- Top Promotions
- Southern Tide
- Three collegiate factories are not covered by the Accord:
  - Coreattire Fashion (Licensee: Milestone Clothing Resources)
  - Cute Dress Industry (Licensee: Glitter Gear, who reports no longer being a licensee)
  - Paxko Ltd. (Licensee: Southern Tide)



#### **COLLEGIATE SUPPLIERS: CONCLUSIONS**

- Significant progress has been made, but serious hazards still exist at collegiate factories
- Progress is slower than it should be
- Some licensees sourcing collegiate product from Bangladesh still have not signed Accord
- 6 collegiate suppliers covered by Accord despite licensee failing to sign
- While most factories have finance plans, it is unclear how much financial support licensees are providing
